WHI's MMOE workgroup to offer community presentations to describe free and low-cost insurance options, encourage enrollment

Informing and educating for better health. The American Rescue Plan, passed in March, dramatically decreased consumer costs for health insurance offered through the Affordable Care Act (ACA) Health Insurance Marketplace. However, many of the uninsured still don't know if they are eligible, if they can afford it, or how to navigate the enrollment process.

Request Mental Health First Aid training for your organization

What is Mental Health First Aid? Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a course that teaches you how to help someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis. The training helps you identify, understand, and respond to signs of addiction and mental illness.



The **Washtenaw County Public Safety and Mental Health Millage** funded training for local instructors who are now equipped to teach this course to community organizations and residents free of charge. There is an initial focus on training health and human services organizations before opening trainings up to a wider audience.
